Considerations when choosing toileting & bathing equipment

Bathtime for kids is for fun, splashing about and playing. For others it might mean quiet time to relax and unwind. For everyone it is important that we feel comfortable and safe. Our range of bathroom products are designed to give needed support, protect, foster independence and provide dignity during personal care activities. Helena Poulton, Advanced Practitioner OT identifies some of the key questions when choosing bathroom equipment.

Bathing

- How will the user get in and out of the bath?
- Will the user sit or lie in the bath?
- Will the user need some help to sit up?
- Will the carer be safe and comfortable?



Showering

- Can the user get in to the shower independently?
- Can the user get close enough to the controls?
- Do the user have good head control?
- Do the user need to adjust your height?
- Will the user feel safe and stable?
- Will the user be at the right height for the carer to help?
- Is there enough space to move around?



Toileting

- Can the user sit without support?
- Can the user get on and off the seat independently?
- Will the user have a hand free to use the toilet roll?
- Are the users feet supported when sitting on the seat?
- Can the user get to the sink to wash hands easily?
- Do the user feel safe and steady enough to use the toilet?
- Do the user feel that privacy and dignity is respected?

Something for all ages and needs

Here are just a few examples from the R82 toileting & bathing range. There are different products for different goals as Helena explains.



Penguin/Orca

The Penguin can be used in the Orca bath tub, but fits ordinary bath tubs as well. With its suction cups, the Penguin sits firmly on most smooth surfaces.



Manatee

The bathing chair is designed to support the user to maintain safe sitting position. The depth of the seat can be adjusted, allowing the bathing chair to “grow” with the child and provides many years of use.



Swan Curo

The shell is carefully designed to enclose the user, ensuring a high seating comfort. The frame is height adjustable and easy to use for the carer.



Heron
